


JANUARY 10: DOVE THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

MARK 1:7-11



2. Why was it important for Jesus to be baptized?



A.

2. Jesus led by example. While He had no sin, he showed the importance of baptism and repentance through his baptism.





1. We're going to make a dove to symbolize the Holy Spirit! Use the sheet with guides printed first. Fold the sheet along line 1V and make sure the triangle is folded exactly a right triangle. Fold the bottom to get an exact line to cut.

2. Cut along your fold line for the bottom. This will make an exact square.



3. Follow the directions from Fold'NFly to create the first dove.

4. Use your plain white paper to make another dove, following the directions. It will be a lot easier after having used the template.



5. Play with your dove! You can make more doves with paper from home if you like. This dove is not a flyable paper airplane, it is decorative.
