JOHN 1:35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, “Behold, the Lamb of God.” The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” — which translated means Teacher —, “where are you staying?” He said to them, “Come, and you will see.” So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, “We have found the Messiah” — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, “You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas” — which is translated Peter.

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1. What does it mean to call Jesus the Lamb of God?


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1. It means that Jesus will be the sacrifice for our sins. In that time, people took lambs to the temple to offer as sacrifices. This helps show people that Jesus is the Messiah, the one whom they have been waiting and searching for.



THE MASS BOX


1. Draw a face on your lamb.
You can use whatever markers, crayons, or pens you like!



2. Wrap the yarn around the lamb to make a fuzzy coat.



3. When you are out of yarn, you can either tuck the end of the yarn underneath the rest of the woolly coat or tie it to itself to not unravel.



4. Play with your lamb and think about how Jesus loves us so much to become the Lamb of God, by his own willingness!
