### LUKE 2:16-21



Jesus said to Nicodemus: “Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.”

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.


And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

4. How will you respond to the light of Christ?




**THE MASS BOX**



1. We are making a paper globe to represent earth. The globe you have is blue, for the water. Tear your green tissue paper to make the green for the land. You may want to crinkle it to make texture or leave it flat.

2. Open your paper lantern, and put the metal bracket in to hold it open. This is easier to do with a buddy for extra hands.



3. Spread glue over the lantern where you want to add land. Then add the green tissue paper to cover the glue and create land masses. Optional: use the toothpick to poke holes in the lantern to create spots of light.

4. Turn on your light, using the switch to keep it on. There is a switch to keep the light on. Hang it inside the lantern from the metal bracket. Turn off the light when you aren't using it to save battery. Hang up your lantern as a night light to remind you of the light Jesus brings into the world!
