MARK 12:28-34

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, “Which is the first of all the commandments?” Jesus replied, “The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.

The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these.”

The scribe said to him, “Well said, teacher. 
1. What is the first commandment?

1. The first commandment is to recognize God as Lord alone and to love Him with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength.



THE MASS BOX




1. Thread a cord through the hole on one side of the clear cross bead. Tie in a double knot to secure.

Then, repeat this step for the other side of the clear bead.



2. Slide 3 pony beads onto both strings of cording in any color order that you would like. Tie the cording in a double knot to secure, and then repeat this on the other side of the bracelet.



3. Slide the ends of the cording on one side through the large black bead. Then slide the ends of the cording on the other side, through the opposite way, so that the ends criss-cross.



4. Adjust the bracelet to fit your wrist, and trim the extra ends before tying a knot on the end of each of the four cords to finish.

Use this bracelet as a reminder of God and His commandments.
